MARITIME ARCHAEOLOGY IN THE 21ST CENTURY

Maritime Archaeology has undergone many developments since its inception, fueled by the advent of SCUBA equipment after the Second World War.

In the 21st century, the discoveries that maritime archaeologists are making continue to amaze, astound and to rewrite the history books. Digital technology is also creating new ways for us to understand old sites and data.

This talk explores how the Centre for Maritime Archaeology at the University of Southampton does maritime archaeology in the 21st century. As well as discussing the process of maritime archaeology, two current projects are presented that are at the cutting edge of technological developments. The first is the digital reconstruction of the 7th Century AD Royal Ship Burial from the site of Sutton Hoo in Suffolk. The second is the largest maritime archaeology project in the world, focusing on the Black Sea, and the unique shipwrecks found during recent investigations by a Southampton-led team.
